# Rules

Open classes are open to all Bell County residents.

- 1. **Registration of entries**: Bell County Fairgrounds at Fourmile, KY, under pavilion Wednesday, July 10- 9:00 a.m. 2:00 p.m. Registration closes promptly at 2:00.
- 2. Judging: Wednesday, July 10- 2:00 p.m. 3:00 p.m.
- 3. Exhibits on display: Wednesday, July 10- 5:00 p.m. 8:00 p.m.
- 4. **Pick up exhibits**: Wednesday, July 10 by 8:00 p.m. If unable to pick up items, can pick up at Bell County Extension Office Thursday, July 11 from 8:00 4:00.
- 5. Only one entry per person per Class #. Please have Class # on each item you enter.
- 6. Labels provided at the time of registration.
- Fruits, vegetables, and foods entered on white Styrofoam plates. Be sure baked food is well cooled before wrapping with clear plastic wrap or gallon size storage bags. Canned food must be in a standard canning jar and sealed.
- 8. **Ribbons:** 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, or 3<sup>rd</sup> place for each Class. **Premiums** for 1<sup>st</sup> is \$5.00, 2<sup>nd</sup> is \$3.00, and 3<sup>rd</sup> is \$2.00. Premiums are paid by the Bell County Fair Board.
- 9. Champion: A Grand and Reserve Champion chosen for each Division.
- 10. Bell County Cooperative Extension Service and Bell County Fair Board are NOT responsible for lost or damaged items.
